## From the Pastor

Epiphany is a big deal - and I'm not talking about the parish in Coon Rapids, though it is always fun to get the clergy of Coon Rapids and St. Michael's fighting about who has the bigger parish. I mean the liturgical feast that we celebrate today that is traditionally celebrated on January 6<sup>th</sup> as the 12<sup>th</sup> day of Christmas. Although magi showing up from the east with strange gifts may seem an odd thing for me to stress as a big deal, the second reading from Ephesians explains why today is so important. Epiphany is the celebration of Christ being made known not just to our Jewish brothers and sisters, but to the nations, and as non-Jews to us.

As the preface for Epiphany and the proper *communiantes* in the Roman Canon say, today is the day we celebrate that Christ, eternal with the Father in glory, appears in a human body to the nations, sharing in our flesh. That means that our redemption is also a fleshy, earthly reality, not just a spiritual one. If we are to follow Christ and show his light to the nations, we have to do so in our actions and our bodily realities, not just our thoughts and spirits. That is a tall order, but the Epiphany reminds us that we are not doing this alone; God took on flesh so that we would have the help and example of Jesus.

One particular way that the Parish Council has asked that we make that love know has come to us from Fr. Mutui. As I know some of you will remember, Fr. Mutui served as pastor here in the 2000's and is working at the St. John Paul II Institute in Kitui, Kenya, which provides job training. He came back to Minnesota to fund-raise for this mission in September but had bad arthritis flair-ups and ended up being hospitalized for a good chunk of his visit. He's therefore reached out to us to see if we'd take up a second collection, and on the advice of the Parish Council we will be doing so next week-end. Because this is not going through the Center for Mission and the Archdiocese, any donations would be a free-will offering cash gift and not subject to a tax write-off. We will be taking up a second collection for this after communion next week and if you wish to write a check, please make it out to the parish.

## RECLAIMING SUNDAYS

The focus of the third and fourth year of the Synod Implementation Plan centers on the family and parents as primary educators of their children. The Year 3 initiative has been subtitled "Reclaiming Sundays" and each parish of the Archdiocese is asked to assist this effort. Each month we will give you a new theme and some sample activities to help you put into practice that theme in order to help you live out the gift of Sunday to its fullest.

### January - Invitation and Prayer

*"The joy of the gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus." - Pope Francis*

Pope Francis reminds all Christians in *Evangelii Gaudium* that the joy that transforms our lives when we encounter the living Jesus is a joy that must be shared. Sample Activities for January:

- Invite someone outside of your family to share an aspect of your "reclaimed Sunday" (e.g. invite a neighbor for dinner, ask family friends to go on a walk with you, etc.)
- Liturgical Living: Intentionally celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord (e.g. light candles and have a little procession to place the Magi in your nativity scene, use blessed chalk to bless your doorways, eat a meal of middle Eastern food, sing "We Three Kings," etc.) Invite someone to share your celebration.
- Liturgical Living: Celebrate the Baptism of the Lord by remembering your own family baptisms. Light your candles, look at photos and videos from the sacramental celebration, invite godparents to share your celebration, bless each other with holy water, pray for your godparents, pray for the priests who baptized you all, etc. While you have all these mementos out, document your family's baptisms dates and mark them on your calendar to celebrate in years to come.
- Recommended resource to assist in building habits of prayer is the Hallow App.

## CATHOLIC Q & A

### THE THREE WISE MEN

**Question:** Magi, Three Kings, Three Wise Men...who were they?

**Answer:** We sing songs, give gifts, and move three mysterious men into our manger scenes. There's a rich heritage in the Catholic Church of celebrating the magi, but their origins are steeped in mystery. The original Greek calls these men *magoi*. The word is translated elsewhere in Scripture to mean "magician," but a similar word was used in ancient history to describe an entirely different set of people altogether. In what is now modern-day Iran, the ruling empire had a wealthy priestly caste known as the Magi. At the time of Christ, the Magi formed one of the ruling councils of the Parthian Empire. These priests interpreted dreams and read the stars to anticipate major events that could affect the fortunes of the empire.

We're not exactly sure where the magi of the Gospels traveled from. Matthew simply says "the east." History tells us that the ancient regions of Persia, Assyria, and Babylon all had a magi priesthood at the time of Christ. Whichever region they hailed from, they likely traveled over one thousand miles over the course of several months to arrive at the Holy Family. Unfortunately for the classic song, there is no concrete evidence these men were themselves kings, though they did bear gifts "from afar" at the prompting of their astronomical calculations.

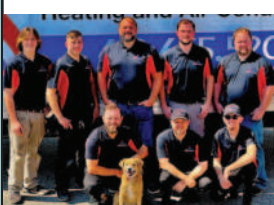
