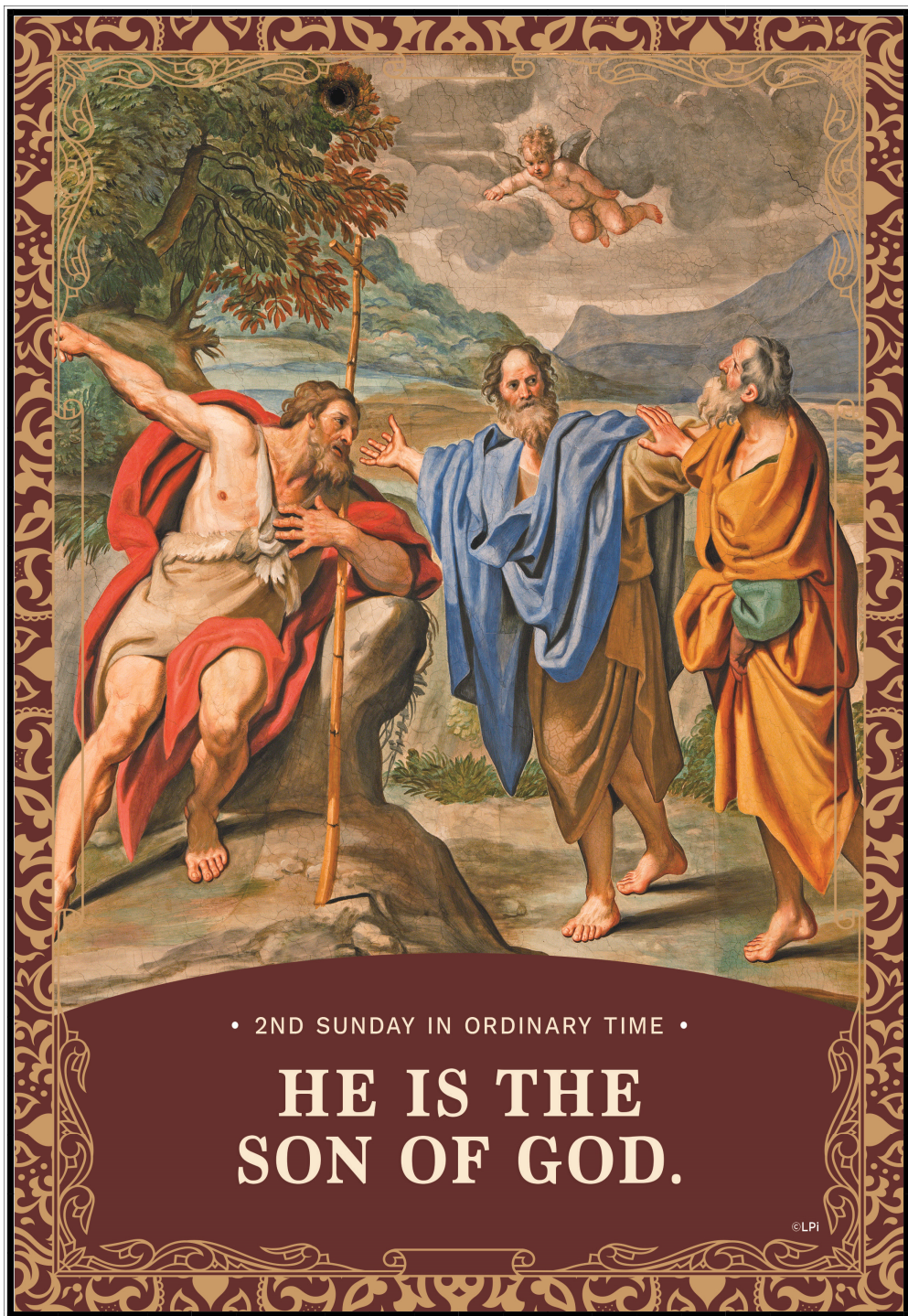

From the Pastor

This Monday as I was putting away the last of my Christmas decorations and left with a house that felt somehow empty, I was reminded of a quote from the first of the Chronicles of Narnia - *the Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe* that it was "always winter, but never Christmas".

And while that may be what this beginning of Ordinary Time feels like, we as Catholics are an incarnational Church. Not only is Christ truly present in the Eucharist we celebrate, adore, and worship, Jesus and the Holy Spirit are meant to abide in the hearts of all the faithful. This weekend's readings are a reflection on the mission of Christ, and how we are called to share in that redemptive work in both big ways and small ways.

One of the big ways for our parish happened this past Tuesday, when we had a special meeting to hear the proposals for the steeple fix. The Parish Council, Finance Council, and Buildings and Grounds Committee after hearing the options all decided that we should pursue the more expensive plan of replacing all the "new" brick. This planned work will be done *in situ* - meaning that while the steeple will be scaffolded for 3-6 months, it will not be removed. With a plan of action determined, the ball is back in Braun Intertec's court as they will now draw up contracts and finalize the scope of work. When we get that, we'll have another big meeting that like this one will be open to anyone, then (if approved) we will send the plan off for approval to the Archdiocese, and upon their approval, we can sign a contract and begin work.

As I hope you all know the steeple project has only been possible because of the sacrifice of this congregation, not just those who attended and voice their opinions, but the real financial sacrifices that have been made. Thank you, and please know of my prayers, and I would ask that you make a deliberate point to pray for one another, one of the small ways, that when done with great love, that we can share in the redemptive work to which we are called.

CATHOLIC Q & A

INSTRUCTION ON RECEIVING COMMUNION

Question: How many times a day can a person receive communion?

Answer: To find an answer to this question, we need to turn to the Church's Code of Canon Law. Here we read, "One who has received the blessed Eucharist may receive it again on the same day only within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates ..." (no. 917). This tells us that the standard answer would be that we can receive communion twice in a day.

Having said that, we also want to be sure that we pay attention to the entire instruction. The phrase "within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates" is important. It means a) that we always have to think of receiving communion as being within a celebration of the Mass and b) we have to be participants in that celebration – we can't simply show up "in time" for communion.

So, when would this rule apply? For example, if you attend Mass on a Saturday morning and then take part in the Sunday Vigil Mass on Saturday evening, you could licitly receive communion at both celebrations. Or, another example, if you receive communion at a wedding or funeral Mass, you could also receive communion at a daily Mass or Sunday Vigil celebrated on the same day. We always want to be sure that we observe the rules for fasting from food and drink before receiving the eucharist (see Code of Canon Law, no. 919).

We should also remember that the Code of Canon Law instructs that anyone who is in danger of death or seriously ill may also receive communion a second time (no. 91, §2).

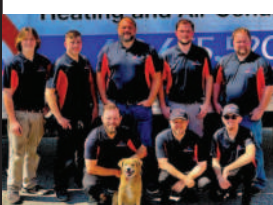
