



From the Pastor

Why does Jesus call disciples? The longer version of this weekend's Gospel ends with the calling of Peter and Andrew and James and John, which is the order Matthew, Mark and Luke say (the Gospel of John tells us that Andrew and John were already followers of John the Baptist, who told them to learn more about Jesus, then gets to the normal calling order) - but why does Jesus call disciples in the first place?

You can come up with many academic answers - that it was tradition for rabbis to take students and show our Lord's intention to engage in active ministry; it was good for eyewitnesses; it serves as the establishment of the Church; etc. But while those answers are correct, they dance around the essential point of why Jesus came: to reveal to us the love of God and to invite us into relationship with God through himself. Jesus calls his disciples to show us that this relationship isn't one of service or fear, but friendship.

As Jesus tells the apostles at the Last Supper (in John chapter 15) he calls them friends because they know Jesus and therefore know the will of God our Father. By knowing and doing the will of God, we grow in friendship with our Lord Jesus Christ, who calls not just the Apostles but us to be his friends.

BLESSING OF CANDLES

Monday, February 2, is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (also called Candlemas). A blessing of candles has been part of this liturgical observance since before 1000 AD. Because this feast falls on a Monday and we don't have Mass on Monday, Fr. Powers will have the blessing after the Masses next weekend, January 31 and February 1. Parishioners are invited to bring small votive candles, pillar candles, tapers or any other candle to Mass to have them blessed. A table will be set up in the front of church for you to place your candles on before Mass. These candles are then taken home and used throughout the coming year during family prayer, storms, times of needs, for intercession or for any time you may need to be reminded of the Light of the World.

Fr. Powers will be offering the traditional blessing of throats following the Tuesday evening Mass on February 3, the Feast of St. Blaise.

CATHOLIC Q & A

WEALTH

Question: If one's gift or talent is making money, and one uses that money for honorable purposes, is it considered a spiritual gift? What does our faith teach us about wealth and stewardship?

Answer: Jesus said it best: to whom much is given, much is expected. All gifts come from God, and our abilities are given to us to be used for the benefit of ourselves and of others and at the service of the Gospel. In an article entitled "The Many Faces of Stewardship," Catherine Doherty wrote about stewardship in the "nitty-gritty everydayness of my life," and about the currency or "money" of spiritual stewardship: love, understanding, and unselfishness.

For a gift to have a spiritual benefit, our intention and involvement would be part of the consideration. If I give money to a charity, but do so in order to gain a tax advantage, it could hardly be a virtuous thing on my part. But if I give because I want to help and, in fact, am even willing to get involved, I have committed myself in a deeper, more meaningful way. Regardless of our money-making talents, in the end, true stewardship comes down to how well we practice the virtues of faith, hope, and love within our life and with those in our community and church. Ultimately, the most important element in stewardship is not intangible—it's you!
