From the Pastor

The Church of the Beatitudes at Tabgha by the Sea of Galilee is absolutely stunning. It is a domed octagonal church built over the ruins of the original Byzantine shrine (most churches in Israel are built over their predecessor Byzantine churches), the interior is paneled with marble, and the dome has these amazing golden mosaics depicting the beatitudes, and surrounding it are amazing gardens and vistas down to the Sea of Galilee (if you have ever been up to Mille Lacs Lake it and the Sea are about the same size). Besides its natural beauty, Tabgha is a plateau situated in the hills, so it's one explanation as to why Matthew describes Jesus's Sermon on the Mount and Luke describes it as a Sermon on the Plain, though the tradition does just stress that this is where the Sermon on the Mount took place.

Despite my clear admiration of Tabgha, I follow the lead of most modern scripture scholars, who argue that the Sermon on the Mount and the Sermon on the Plain are separate speeches, because it makes sense to me that throughout our Lord's 3 years of ministry, Jesus would have repeated themes, and the theme of the Sermons is essential to understanding our Lord's work, which is why Matthew and Luke both start the main portion of their Gospels with these Sermons. As Benedict XVI summarizes in *Jesus of Nazareth*, the Beatitudes are eschatological promises - that to those who are hungry, poor, persecuted, who make peace, who keep themselves pure of heart - the Lord will grant comfort. But even though eschatological promises will find their complete fulfillment when our Lord comes again, these promises are also fulfilled in the here and now. Even when we find ourselves afflicted, by living out the Beatitudes, we will have blessedness, the blessedness that comes from the nearness of God. This inversion of the order that we are used to because of the fall achieved from the restoration of God's grace, is as real today as when our Lord promised it at Tabgha.

CATHOLIC Q & A

VOCATION OR CALLING

Question: Can you explain what we mean by a vocation or calling? I have heard this term used in many different contexts and am not sure what it means. Does it apply to religious life?

Answer: A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call.
