

From the Pastor

On this last Sunday before Lent, our readings remind us that we are called to a high standard of living - not only are we called to listen to the message of the Law and the Prophets of the Old Testament, but Jesus wants us to embody their message to a higher degree than even the Jewish leaders of our Lord's day would have expected. Paul reminds the Corinthians and therefore us that this high standard doesn't rely just on our human strength, but on the power and grace of God, so it is not just our efforts but rather the Holy Spirit's efforts at work, although we of course are called to do all we can to cooperate with the Holy Spirit.

We cooperate particularly with the Holy Spirit through prayer. Although we are called to good works, work is meant to be the material expression of our life of prayer, so in Lent we are called to deepen that relationship with God through our habit of prayer.

Throughout the centuries much has been written on the efficacious nature of the Rosary as a particular type of prayer, and as our country prepares to celebrate its 250th anniversary, Fr. Eugene Theisen, pastor of St. Wenceslaus in New Prague, retired air force chaplain, and a man who gets incredibly lucky cuts in Cribbage, has suggested that parishes across the Archdiocese offer 250 rosaries for the 250th anniversary of the country. You will find in the back of church a poster with empty stars and star stickers next to it; when you offer a Rosary for our nation, please place a star on the empty ones. I'm hopeful that we can get at least one poster done before Independence Day, and not only pray for our country, but strengthen our own habits of prayer.

LENTEN REGULATION REMINDER

The Christian faithful are called to do penance through prayer, fasting, abstinence and by exercising works of piety and charity throughout the season of Lent. All Fridays through the year, and especially during Lent, are penitential days.

Abstinence All who have reached their 14th birthday are to abstain from eating meat (beast or fowl) on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays during Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Fasting - All those who are 18 or older, until their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meal is allowed on days of fast. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's need; but together, they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. The obligation does not apply to those whose health or ability to work would be affected seriously.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - All the faithful who have reached the age of reason (second grade) are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year. Lent is a good time to fulfill this precept of the Church.

Lenten Observances - Each weekday of Lent is also an obligatory day of penance. Some recommendations include the participation in daily Mass, increased prayer or spiritual study, self-imposed fasting or abstinence, Eucharistic adoration, works of charity, generosity to programs which benefit others especially the poor, and participation in traditional Lenten Devotions.
