

As I've mentioned before, one of my favorite Lenten devotions is the Stations of the Cross. Although I would encourage everyone to attend Stations based upon their schedule, I really encourage attending this Friday, March 6th. Not only will there be a Soup Supper, but our Faith Formation students will be leading Stations of the Cross. This actually goes really well with this weekend's readings, which remind us particularly that God desires to have a relationship with us. God doesn't just call Abraham, God gives us grace through Jesus Christ to become His adopted children. You see this in how we talk about God - because God the Father is the Lord's Father, God becomes our Father.

It may not seem profound, but for non-Christian religions both ancient and modern this idea of universal adoption is unique. God may adopt a person or a particular people, but not everyone, and that is what makes our faith special, that we believe that God desires to bring all people into union with Himself. We live out that union when we practice our faith, and so I always find great joy and hope when we see how the generations put into practice the faith that others have strived to pass on to them and live out in their own lives. This week's stations are one of those ways, and I would encourage you all to join us in prayer at 7:00 p.m. on March 6th.

RECLAIMING SUNDAYS

The focus of the third and fourth year of the Synod Implementation Plan centers on the family and parents as primary educators of their children. The Year 3 initiative has been subtitled "Reclaiming Sundays" and each parish of the Archdiocese is asked to assist this effort. Each month we will give you a new theme and some sample activities to help you put into practice that theme in order to help you live out the gift of Sunday to its fullest.

March - Elevated Conversation and Prayer *"The spirit of love which reigns in a family guides both mother and child in their conversations; therein they teach and learn, experience correction and grow in appreciation of what is good."* - *Evangelii Gaudium 139* The power of conversation in a family cannot be overstated. The act of listening with the ear of the heart and responding out of love to what was heard is the bedrock of trust in the family. Taking time to engage in this kind of conversation can often get pushed aside for the utilitarian needs that take priority in working to manage frantic family life. Sample Activities for March:

- Set aside time for intentional conversation and check on each other's "highs and lows" from the week.
- Read or listen to the daily Gospels. Discuss the reading.
- Set aside one-on-one time between a parent and a child to encourage conversations that may be lost in the busyness of family life. (Go out for breakfast or coffee/cocoa, etc.)
- Consider a silent dinner (counter intuitive to elevated conversation) - during the silent dinner, a piece of music is listened to or a book is read. This will lead to elevated conversation following the experience.
- Liturgical Living: Celebrate St. Joseph's solemnity - Honor your father and grandfathers; Show appreciation to your priest. Celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation - It is a break from Lent and nine months to Christmas!

CATHOLIC Q & A

VIOLENT CONFLICTS

Question: What is the Christian attitude towards violent conflicts?

Answer: In the Beatitudes, Jesus teaches us "Blessed are the peacemakers" and to "love your enemies." All human beings are made in God's image and likeness. We are one human family — brothers and sisters despite what divides us. Christians have the obligation to prioritize peaceful means to resolve conflicts. War wreaks a toll on a nation. Civilians bear a disproportionate burden of this cost during the war itself and as the nation rebuilds. However, those in authority have the obligation to protect the innocent.

During the gradual fall of the Roman Empire, theologians began to theorize that war could be just if it was a defensive measure of last resort. The "Just War Theory" was later expanded by St. Thomas Aquinas, who also included moral obligations during the war itself, including the protection of civilians. Those in public authority have the obligation to carefully examine their motives, agendas, and rationale for violent force. Should a cause be just, those who fight and defend under such circumstances must be valued and honored. They deserve our support both during and after the war. ©LPi

LENTEN REGULATION REMINDER

The Christian faithful are called to do penance through prayer, fasting, abstinence and by exercising works of piety and charity throughout the season of Lent. All Fridays through the year, and especially during Lent, are penitential days.

Abstinence All who have reached their 14th birthday are to abstain from eating meat (beast or fowl) on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays during Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - All the faithful who have reached the age of reason (second grade) are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins as least once a year. Lent is a good time to fulfill this precept of the Church.

Lenten Observances - Each weekday of Lent is also an obligatory day of penance. Some recommendations include the participation in daily Mass, increased prayer or spiritual study, self-imposed fasting or abstinence, Eucharistic adoration, works of charity, generosity to programs which benefit others especially the poor, and participation in traditional Lenten Devotions.


