

From the Pastor

In the coda of the musical Les Miserables, the last line before the finale is "to love another person is to see the face of God." And although that line wasn't written by Victor Hugo, but Herbert Kretzmer, who adapted the classic French novel into the stage musical, it does echo the thought of Richard of St. Victor whose work on the Trinity contains the phrase "*Amor oculus est et amare videre est*" - love is the eye and to love is to see.

This Sunday we read another long gospel, this time about our Lord's healing of a blind man and the controversies that arise from it - why was the man born blind, why did Jesus heal him the way our Lord did, who exactly does Jesus think He is? - but there is a great line when the formerly blind man is questioned - that he doesn't know the answers but he knows that he was blind and now can see.

This Sunday is also Laetare Sunday - the Church reminds us that we are meant to rejoice in the middle of our penance. That may seem like a strange request by mother Church, but if we put these things together, we understand that our penance is meant to be ordered to the works of love. Not only are our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving meant to be concrete ways that we do actions of charity, but by doing charity we also are meant become more loving people, and therefore can see better Christ. That is the joy of Laetare Sunday and the joy that is meant to be at the heart of our lives of faith.

CATHOLIC Q & A

TAKE UP OUR CROSS

Question: What does Jesus mean when he talks about taking up our cross?

Answer: Our journey of faith begins in baptism. When we are faithful to it, we find God's plan for us, his way of allowing us to participate in his saving work, which in turn becomes for us our own salvation. Stated simply, we share in the mission of Jesus each day. We live our life with all of its ups, downs, joys, and sorrows in union with the mission of Jesus. Our work then is holy. It is joined to the cross, God's will for Jesus – the way in which he destroys sin and death and makes eternal life possible. His sacrifice accomplishes what we ourselves cannot do.

To take up the cross, then, means that we share in the mission of Jesus and so embrace the sufferings of the cross. It is our daily life made holy, given a redemptive mission. It is our purpose and goal to unite our life to that of Christ. St. Paul says it best, "If we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection" (Rom 6:5).
