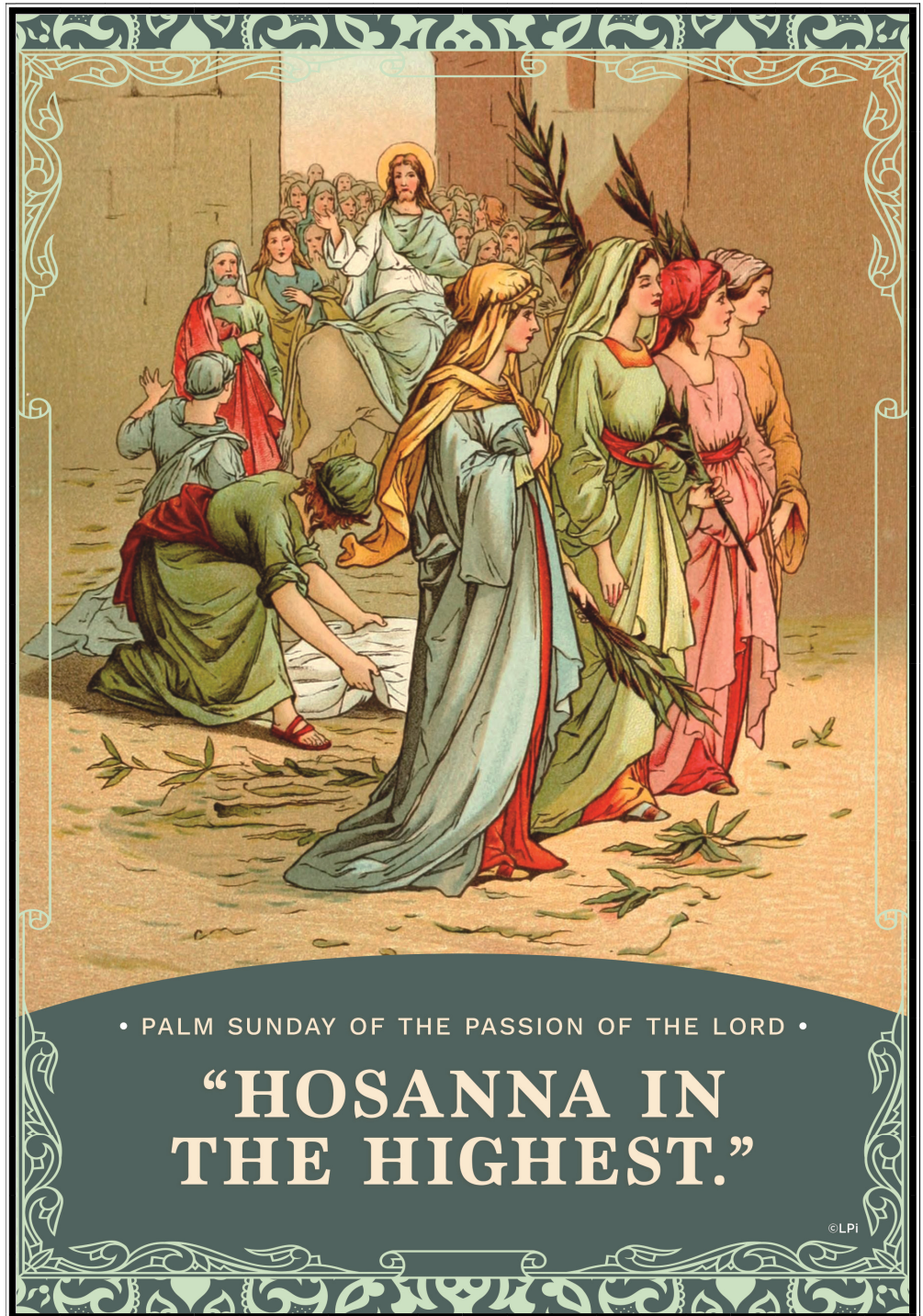

From the Pastor

At the Jewish celebration of the Passover, the story of the Exodus is retold over the course of the Seder dinner. The start of the night begins with 4 ritual questions, which would have been the same since before the time of Jesus - the first of which is "How is this night different than every other night?" - and I think we should ask ourselves a variation of it as the Church enters into Holy Week - what makes this week more holy than any other?

I'm not asking in an empirical sense - I know the answer is the celebration of the Passion of the Lord - but rather a subjective sense - what do you do to mark this time and make it holy? I hope a partial answer is coming to church a lot - for the mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday then spending time in prayer after, attending one or both of the Good Friday services, and maybe even staying up late at the Easter Vigil - but what do you do differently at home, in how you use your time to mark this week with the Church?

Each of the passions highlights different things, and Matthew's account in particular highlights that after our Lord's death, the earth quakes, graves are opened, "saints are raised" and appeared to many after the Lord's resurrection. Matthew mentions this to stress that the death of Jesus brings about the completion of time. We are not looking forward to the end of days, we are living them, as we live out the exaltation of the Lord that St. Paul tells the Philippians they are also to live out. This exaltation is lived out in how we live the central mystery of our faith - our Lord's passion, death, and resurrection, and means that Holy Week should be different than the rest of our weeks as we enter most solemnly into the heart of our faith.

CEMETERY SPRING CLEAN UP

We ask that all wreaths and old flowers be removed from St. John the Baptist Cemetery as soon as possible. Beginning April 8, we will begin removing any wreaths and unsightly flowers that remain in the cemetery.

GOOD FRIDAY PASCHAL FAST AND ABSTINENCE REMINDER

Remember to observe the rules of fasting and abstinence on Good Friday and if possible throughout Holy Saturday.

Fasting All who are 18 years of age and older until age 59 may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's need; but together, they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

Abstinence All who have reached their 14th birthday are to abstain from eating meat (beast or fowl) on all Fridays during Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

OLD PALMS COLLECTION

You may bring your old palms to church with you and place them in the collection bins located at the entrances of the church so they may be burned at the Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday.
