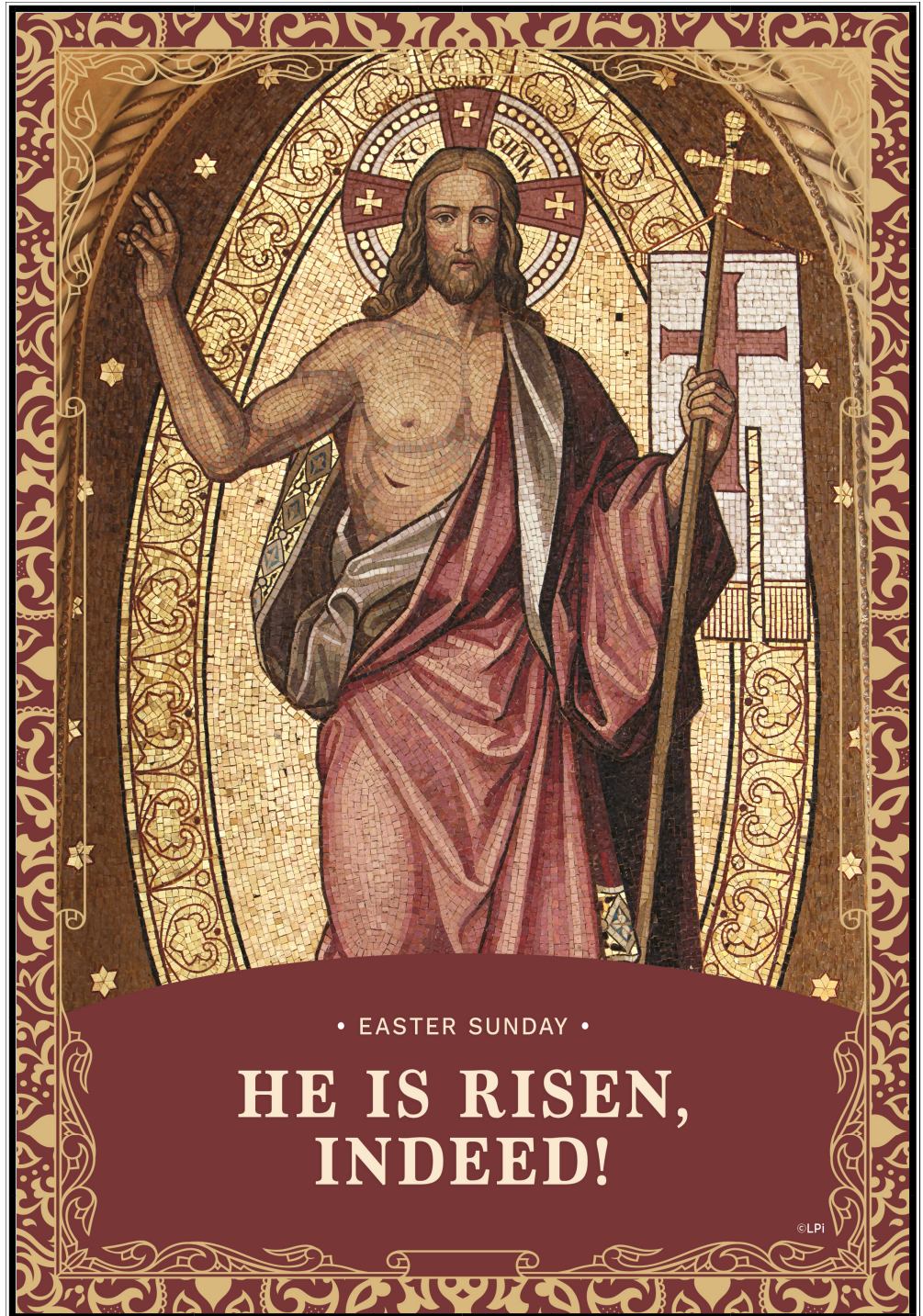

### From the Pastor

Happy Easter! As always at Easter, I am filled with a spirit of gratitude: for all those who attended our services during Holy Week, for all those who helped in a variety of roles, but above all the gratitude that comes from our Easter joy, that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead and that through our Risen Lord our sins are forgiven.

One particular of the Easter season is that our first reading, which normally comes from the Old Testament instead is from the Acts of the Apostles, to remind us how the first followers of Christ responded to that Easter joy. It's my intention this Easter season to focus on that first reading in my preaching, so that we as a parish can be reminded that we like those first Christians live out our witness to the Risen Lord in how we live out that Easter joy.

The Exultet - sung at the Easter Vigil, the greatest of all the chants of the Church - ends by proclaiming that Christ, who has come back from death, has come to shed his peaceful light on all humanity, and prays that our faith, represented at the Vigil and throughout the days of Easter by the Paschal candle, would shine forth, and that I think is a great prayer for us both on this Easter day and in the season to come.

## **RECLAIMING SUNDAYS**

The focus of the third and fourth year of the Synod Implementation Plan centers on the family and parents as primary educators of their children. The Year 3 initiative has been subtitled "Reclaiming Sundays" and each parish of the Archdiocese is asked to assist this effort. Each month we will give you a new theme and some sample activities to help you put into practice that theme in order to help you live out the gift of Sunday to its fullest.

**April - Breaking Bread and Prayer** *"But because of its special solemnity and the obligatory presence of the community, and because it is celebrated 'on the day when Christ conquered death and gave us a share in his immortal life,' the Sunday Eucharist expresses with greater emphasis its inherent ecclesial dimension. It becomes the paradigm for other Eucharistic celebrations. Each community, gathering all its members for the 'breaking of the bread,' becomes the place where the mystery of the Church is concretely made present."* - *Dies Domini 34.* Just as we gather around the banquet feast at the Eucharist, our families can model this communal breaking of the bread in our own homes through celebrating the day with a special meal and extended time at the table. Sample Activities for April:

- Create a special meal and share time at the table together.
- Find ways to incorporate Alleluias into your family's prayer. (Sing it, pray it, decorate your prayer space with it, greet each other with it ...)
- Plan ways your family can intentionally celebrate the season of Easter for all 50 days (especially appropriate on Sundays).
- Learn the *Regina Caeli* prayer:

### **Queen of Heaven**

V. Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.  
R. For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia.  
V. Has risen, as he said, alleluia.  
R. Pray for us to God, alleluia.  
V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.  
R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

Let us pray. O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

## CATHOLIC Q & A

### EASTER

**Question:** Why is the Easter season so long? And should we be doing something special for it?

**Answer:** You've probably noticed the priest continuing to wear white vestments at the Sunday liturgy. While we celebrated Christ's resurrection several weeks ago, the Easter season extends fifty days — just over seven weeks — from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. For most of that time — about six weeks — Jesus is still with the disciples, teaching and encouraging them. The Easter season isn't just a celebration of when Jesus is with us. At the Last Supper, Jesus promised to send an "advocate" or "counselor" when he left. At the Ascension, he directs the disciples to await "power from on high" — the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Ascension completes the Paschal Mystery, beginning with Jesus' suffering and death and continuing in the resurrection. But the Holy Spirit ushers in a new era for the Church.

After spending weeks in prayer, fasting, and service during Lent, it may seem odd that we don't widely have similar practices for Easter. That doesn't mean you can't embrace the season! Commit to taking moments of little joy throughout the weeks, like random acts of kindness towards others. Consider reading the Acts of the Apostles to learn more about the early Church or picking up an Easter devotional to pray with. He is still risen indeed!
