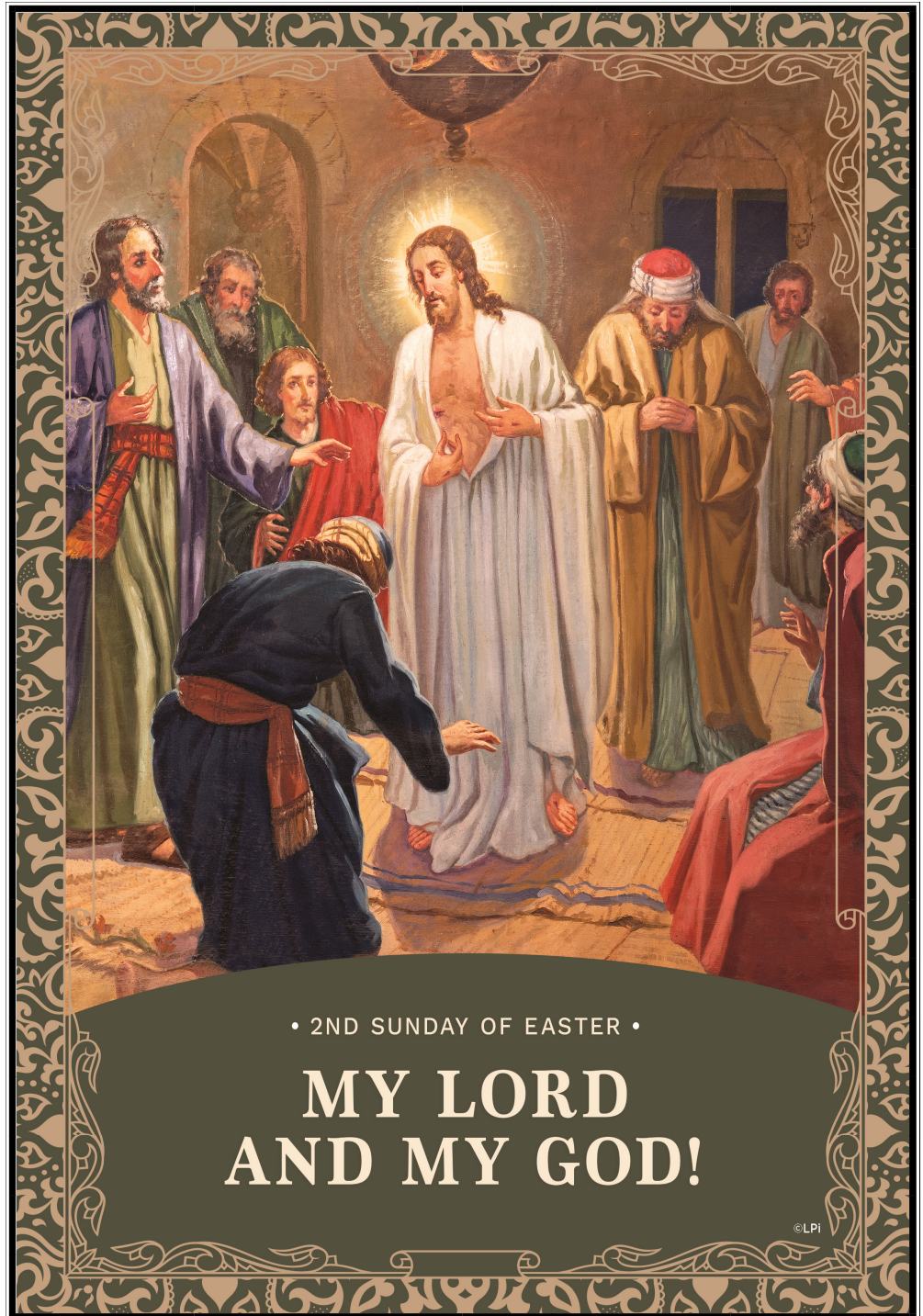

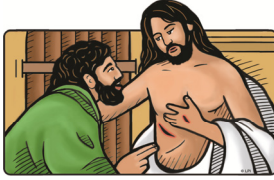

## From the Pastor

I know I've talked before about historiography - the defining principle of what makes history a thing instead of just a bunch of dates and facts - but historiography itself is subject to its own influence of narrative - so for example Herodotus, the first historian, was an Ionian Greek whose home had been conquered by the Persians so not surprisingly when writing his history of the wars between the Greek and Persians he has some biases. Same thing with Marxist or historical materialist history - there will be an emphasis or bias on the division of labor from capital - or feminist history - to focus on the often-silent and under-reported contributions of women.

The reason I'm bringing up this jargon is that today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells us the narrative key for understanding the whole Church. The early Christians devoted themselves "to the teaching of the Apostles, the communal life, the breaking of the bread, and to the prayers." These actions motivated them to radical love of neighbor and to the sharing of goods, as it has for members of various religious communities and groups and even us to a lesser extent when at mass with the bread and wine we also present our offerings to God. Prayer, the teaching of the apostles, community, and the breaking of bread - the Eucharist are still the foundation of the Church 2000 years later.

This Easter, I am not asking you to give entirely of yourselves, but I am asking you to consider giving of your time - one of my goals for this year is an increase in our volunteer numbers particularly of liturgical ministers because as the parish continues to grow we need to keep up with that growth. We need more choir members, more servers, more readers, more ushers, more Eucharistic ministers, and on April 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> after all the masses I will be holding training for Eucharistic ministers so that they can be commissioned the next weekend when our children will also be making their first holy communion. So if that is a ministry you'd be interested, please contact the parish office either by phone or email (that information is on the front of the bulletin), and we'd be happy to add you to the roster.

## RECLAIMING SUNDAYS

The focus of the third and fourth year of the Synod Implementation Plan centers on the family and parents as primary educators of their children. The Year 3 initiative has been subtitled "Reclaiming Sundays" and each parish of the Archdiocese is asked to assist this effort. Each month we will give you a new theme and some sample activities to help you put into practice that theme in order to help you live out the gift of Sunday to its fullest.

**April - Breaking Bread and Prayer** *"But because of its special solemnity and the obligatory presence of the community, and because it is celebrated 'on the day when Christ conquered death and gave us a share in his immortal life,' the Sunday Eucharist expresses with greater emphasis its inherent ecclesial dimension. It becomes the paradigm for other Eucharistic celebrations. Each community, gathering all its members for the 'breaking of the bread,' becomes the place where the mystery of the Church is concretely made present."* - *Dies Domini 34.* Just as we gather around the banquet feast at the Eucharist, our families can model this communal

breaking of the bread in our own homes through celebrating the day with a special meal and extended time at the table. Sample Activities for April:

- Create a special meal and share time at the table together.
- Find ways to incorporate Alleluias into your family's prayer. (Sing it, pray it, decorate your prayer space with it, greet each other with it ...)
- Plan ways your family can intentionally celebrate the season of Easter for all 50 days (especially appropriate on Sundays).
- Learn the *Regina Caeli* prayer:

### Queen of Heaven

V. Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.  
R. For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia.  
V. Has risen, as he said, alleluia.  
R. Pray for us to God, alleluia.  
V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.  
R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

Let us pray. O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

## CATHOLIC Q & A

### DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

**Question:** Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

**Answer:** If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, “a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come.”
