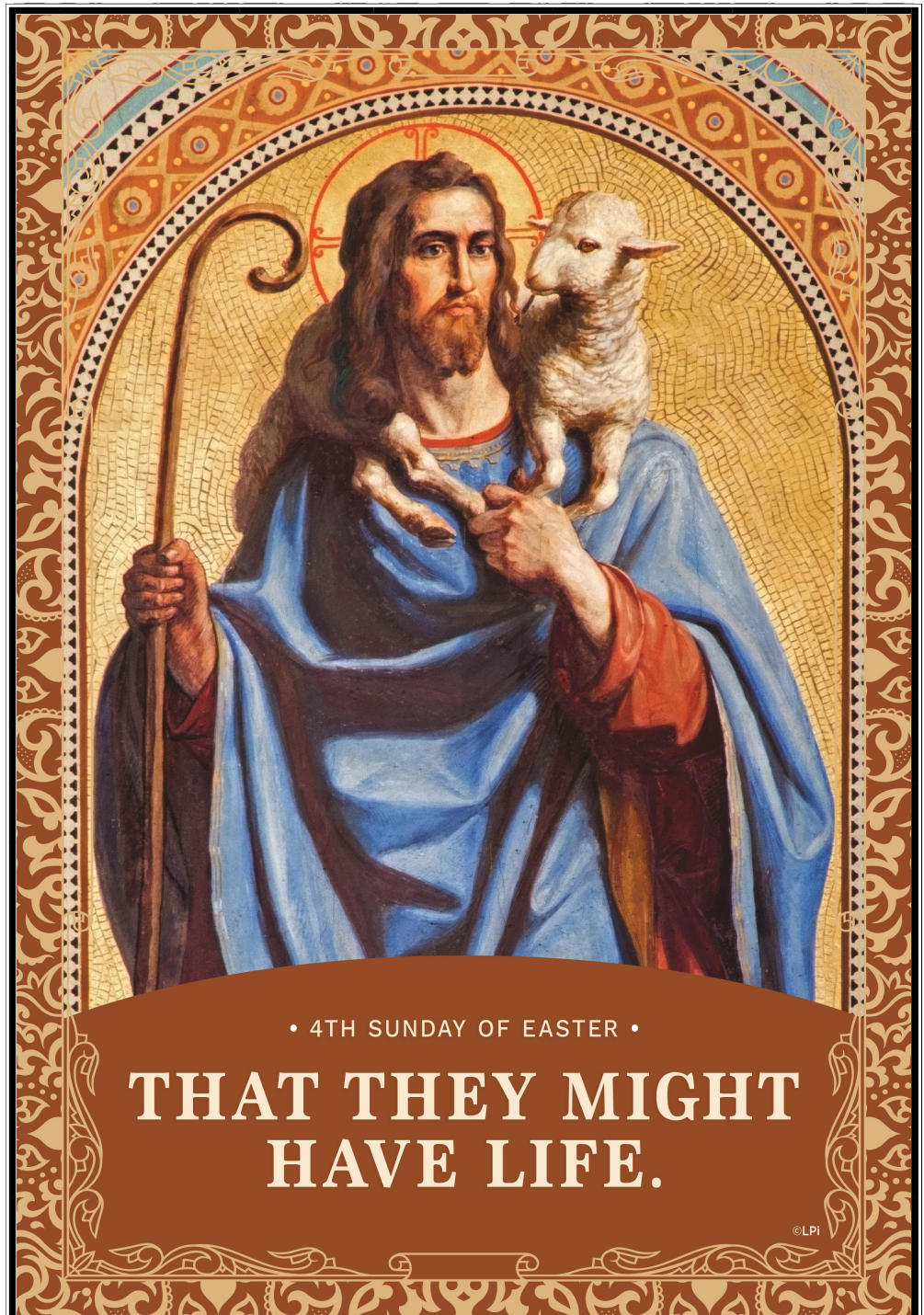

From the Pastor

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is also known as Good Shepherd Sunday - our Gospel is always from John 10 - the Good Shepherd discourse. The image of Christ the Good Shepherd is one that I am very familiar with as my home parish, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, started life as a Methodist church before being sold to the Italians in the 1920's. Since the building was built by Protestants, its two main stain glass windows were of Christ the Good Shepherd and Christ the Sower - though the Italian nonnas insisted that Christ the Sower was actually St. Joseph. If you stop in our parish offices, in the hallway I have a very elaborate needlepoint of Christ the Good Shepherd that my mother made for my childhood pastor that came to me after his death, so I would say the Good Shepherd is near and dear to me.

But my familiarity with the image is vastly overshadowed by the actual Good Shepherd, our Lord Jesus Christ. The point of the image is to remind us that Jesus always loves us. While I certainly enjoy writing and telling you all stories about art and history and such, I do so because I hope that from these examples you would be directed to a deeper understanding of the loving care of Christ the Good Shepherd, and for us to learn to listen to His voice. It is only by growing in this relationship of trust that we learn to follow after the Lord, and so I would invite you on this Good Shepherd Sunday to think about what reminders you have of God's goodness and to spend some time remembering the love of God so that you will follow after Christ, the Good Shepherd.

CATHOLIC Q & A

EXALTATION OF THE CROSS

Question: What is the history behind the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross?

Answer: Emperor Constantine's mother, Helena, is credited with having discovered the true cross around 330. She traveled to the Holy Land and uncovered the places associated with Jesus' life. Legend has it that Helena uncovered three crosses but was not able to detect the true cross until each of them was laid on a leper. Only one of them cured the leper, proving it to be the true cross. A great church was built at the site, and soon various portions of the cross were sent to other churches as relics to be venerated.

The day after the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, September 14, 335, the actual cross was displayed for veneration. Egeria, a women traveler to Jerusalem around the year 386, kept a diary that has survived. She tells of the unique veneration of the wood of the cross that took place on Good Friday, something maintained ritually to this very day.

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross focuses on the gift of love that Jesus manifested by his total gift of self, offered for all. The cross, the ultimate form of capital punishment in its day, has become for us the ultimate symbol of love and triumph over evil and death.
