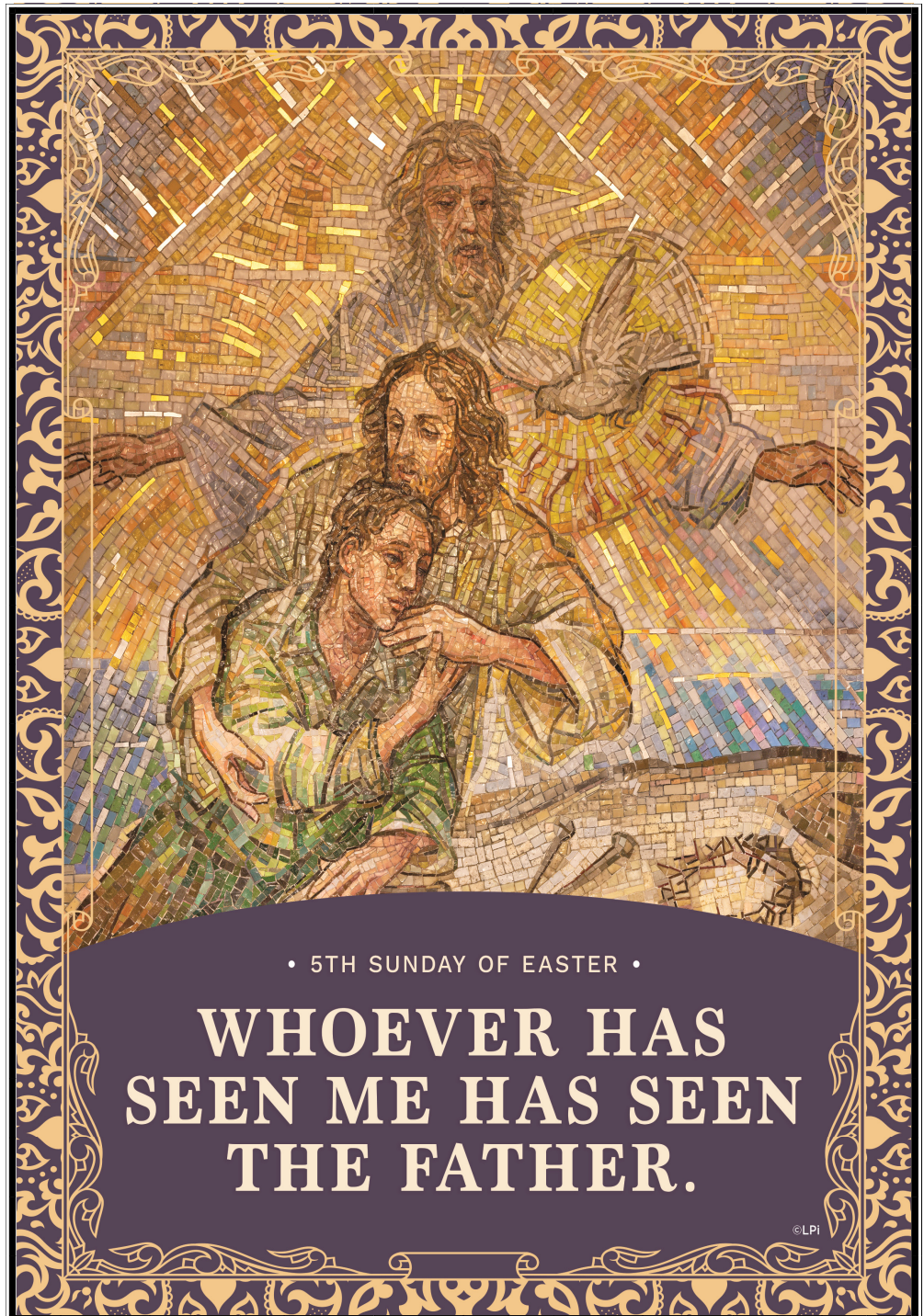

From the Pastor

This weekend is one of my favorites of the year- not because it's the fifth Sunday of Easter but because it's first communion weekend. Jesus tells Thomas in this weekend's Gospel that he (Jesus) is the way, the truth, and the life, and we as Catholics have lived this out in our commitment to the Eucharist - the source and summit of our faith and the bread of life. We hear in the first reading that this was so important to the Church that the apostles created an entirely new grouping in the sacrament of Holy Orders - deacons - to attend to the needs of the Church so that the apostles could dedicate themselves more fully to the proclaiming of God's word and to serving at the (Eucharistic) table.

One of my favorite symbolic actions at mass is the presentation of gifts: that along with the bread and wine that will become the Body and Blood of the Lord, we also bring up the collection basket. While our parish always has ongoing costs (as I write this on Wednesday I'm waiting for a contractor to come look at the leaking convent roof), those gifts are really meant to represent an offering of ourselves, that it's not just money we are meant to offer to the Lord, but all of who we are, which is how we become that royal priesthood that Peter talks about in our second reading today. While that may seem like a big ask, the Eucharist exists to draw us deeper into union with Jesus by his real presence there, and that is my hope, not just for those who are about to receive him for the first time, but for all of us, that by our reception of Jesus in the Eucharist we may grow ever deeper in union with him.

PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Parish Council Elections will take place next weekend - May 9 and 10. We will follow the same process as last year to elect members. Parishioners will be asked to nominate up to 3 people for the council. The person with the highest number of nominations will be asked if they will accept the nomination and serve on the Parish Council, then the person with the next highest number of nominations, likewise, and on down the line until the 3 positions are filled. There will not be a second "election ballot" process. Please carefully read the position description below and prayerfully consider whether you might nominate yourself or someone else for this position. There are three member's terms expiring this year: Adam Benney, Angie Haggerty and Lisa Crosby. Adam and Angie are completing their first term and are eligible for re-election; Lisa is completing her second term and is ineligible for re-election.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

Position Title: Parish Pastoral Advisory Council Member

Responsible to: Pastor and Fellow Parishioners

Works with: Pastor, other Pastoral Council members, parish staff, trustees, and auxiliary groups within the parish.

Purpose of the Position: This position serves in an advisory capacity to the Pastor along with other Pastoral Council members.

Responsibilities: This position is responsible to research the needs, concerns, hopes and activities of the Parish and to bring these to the Pastoral Advisory Council for discussion and recommendations which will allow the Pastor to carry out his leadership role in the parish. You may be asked to take an office on the council; Chairman, Vice-Chair, or Secretary, as voted by fellow council members. You may also be asked to serve as a liaison to one of the subcommittees. These positions change annually.

Qualifications: This person must be a registered parishioner of St. John the Baptist Parish and a practicing Catholic in full communion with the Church. Full-time parish employees are ineligible to be members of the Parish Pastoral Council.

Amount of Time Required: Meetings are held monthly, lasting approximately 2 hours. The date and times of the meetings will be determined by the Pastor. You may also be asked to attend further meetings, retreats, or gatherings as determined by the Pastor.

When and Where the Ministry is Performed: The Pastoral Council meets in the parish social hall.

Length of Commitment: The council member will serve a 3-year term, beginning in June of any given year, and ending in June, 3 years later. Council members are limited to two consecutive - 3 year terms. Once you have served two consecutive - 3 year terms, you are ineligible for re-election for 1 year.

Training Provided: No specific training is necessary to hold the council position, but you may be required to attend further training or retreats as requested.

Responsible To: Each council member is responsible to report to the Pastor, as head of the Pastoral Advisory Council.

CATHOLIC Q & A

CATECHETICAL SUNDAY

Question: Why do we celebrate Catechetical Sunday?

Answer: The mission of the church reflects the mission of Jesus to teach, preach, heal, and forgive. Through these acts, Jesus shares the good news of salvation and invites all people to share in the life and love of God. The church continues this mission in all its ministries, but especially, and perhaps most importantly, through catechesis.

Catechetical Sunday is celebrated on the third Sunday of September. The task of handing on the Gospel is entrusted to the whole community, who by word and example, form young and new members in the way of the Gospel. Parish programs assist parents in teaching the basics of faith through liturgical experience, instruction, and faith formation. This ministry is essential for the parish to grow, for individuals to develop as believers, and for the ongoing spiritual formation of the whole community. It reminds the church that preaching the Gospel and growing in faith are essential to our sacramental practice and our liturgical prayer.

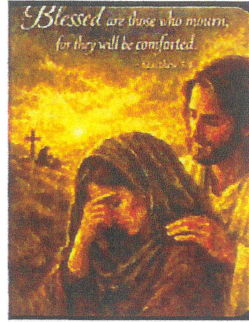
