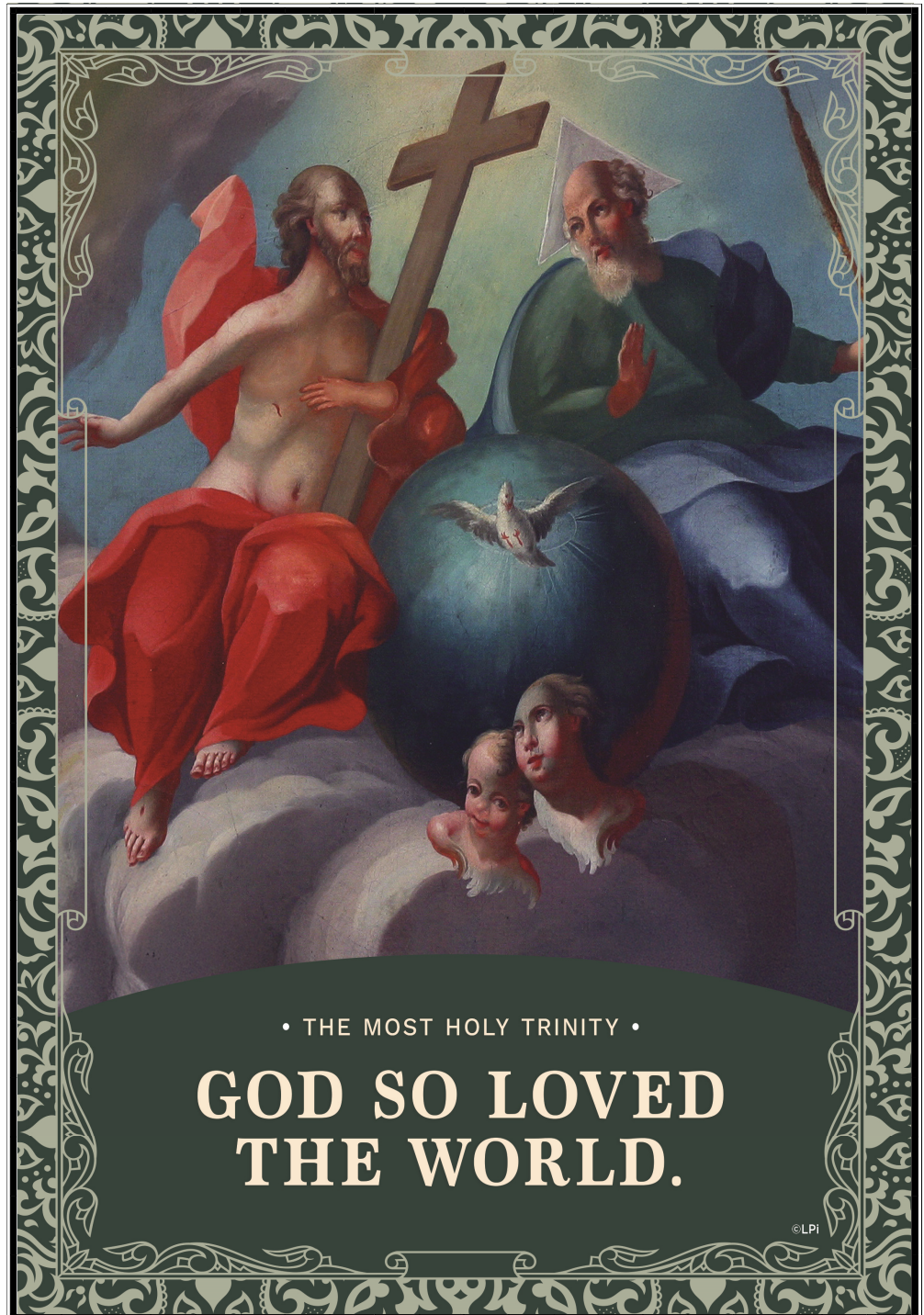

## From the Pastor

On Memorial Day, Pope Leo published his first encyclical *Magnifica Humanitas*. As with all documents produced by the Church, the name comes from the first two words in Latin of the first sentence: "Humanity, created by God in all its grandeur, is today facing a pivotal choice: either to construct a new Tower of Babel or to build the city in which God and humanity dwell together" - so rather than translating it as Magnificent Humanity like I thought I would, I think the Grandeur of Humanity is a more fitting translated title.

The PDF of the document is only 52 pages - 8 of which are footnotes, so the main text is only 44 pages long. I would encourage everyone to read it, but I am going to summarize for you as well: the document is structured with an introduction and 5 parts and the first part is a very well written review of Catholic social teaching focusing in particular on the contributions of the Popes; the second a review of principles of Catholic social teaching concluding with an examen that I think is an important action step for us to do, because the third part has to do with the use of AI.

In my opinion the two most important takeaways for us from that section is a concern about what Pope Leo calls a "concentration of power" - that AI must be used in accord with the principles outlined in part 2 and a declaration in paragraphs 104-105 that AI is not morally neutral and is subject to the Church's teachings on ethics and therefore "responsibility must be clearly defined at every stage: from those who design and develop these systems to those who use them and rely on them for concrete decisions" - something that is currently lacking in our world as most developers of AI are private transnational parties. Section Three also address the transhumanism and posthumanism ideology that some of the parties seem to espouse, but as always, the Church reminds us that our grandeur comes from our choices to do good, and Leo particularly cites Saints and figures who had to make the active choice to serve and work with the poor.

Section 4 has practical suggestions for how we ought to deal with the present situation but rather than trying to summarize them all, in general the principles at work are the need for truth across all parts of society, respect for the value of human work, and the importance of freedom of persons - in this section there is an apology for the Church's willingness to tolerate slavery in the early modern period which is making headlines (historically the Church, although it wasn't super in favor

allowed the Spanish and Portuguese to practice slavery in their colonies - talk to me if you want to go down that rabbit hole). The final section is a reminder in these times of increased division and conflict, while dealing with what Leo calls a false realism about the use of force, the Church must call the world to truth, that we are meant to build a civilization of love, and this is based upon the love revealed to us by our Lord Jesus Christ. Leo even pulls a quote from the Lord of the Rings that we are not meant to master all the world but to work "uprooting the evil in the fields that we know, so that those who live after may have clean earth to till." I will be certainly talking more on how we are meant to live out that love, but I hope this is a helpful guide to your reading.

## THE REALITY OF MENTAL ILLNESS

Clinical depression is not just "the blues" which we all experience now and then. It is normal to feel sad or upset at times because of the death of a loved one, from a divorce and in times of illness. Too much work or troubles at home also can be stressful, but most people can get through these difficult times without becoming clinically depressed. Some people mistakenly believe that only people who have experienced depressive symptoms for months, or who have completely lost their ability to function, have clinical depression. In fact, when the symptoms of depression last more than two weeks, or when the symptoms are severe enough to interfere with daily life, you may have clinical depression. Contact your doctor or a psychiatrist if you or someone you know is hurting. Depression is a treatable illness.

## CATHOLIC Q & A

### SALVATION

**Question:** In some passages of the Bible, Jesus makes it sound like only a few people will be saved. But we talk about hoping for everyone's salvation. So which one is it – will many or few people be saved?

**Answer:** Salvation is a mystery of God's grace. St. Paul encourages us to offer prayers for everyone. He calls it "*good and pleasing to God*" because God Himself "*wills everyone to be saved*" (c.f. 1 Tm 2:1-4). The redemption that Jesus offers is held out to all of us. His sacrifice on the cross was already for everyone. Now it is a matter of if and how we accept that salvation in our own lives.

Here on earth, we can't possibly know the exact number of people who will be in heaven. When we hear words like "many" and "few," we tend to think of them in quantitative terms. Four wine glasses for six guests is too few. Three slices of cake for one person is too many. For God, however, "many" and "few" are qualitative terms. Imagine for a moment that nearly every human person is in heaven and only a handful had, by their actions on earth, separated themselves from God. For a God who infinitely loves, even one person spending eternity apart from Him is too many! ©LPi
