

From the Pastor

There is a legend about St. Augustine, that one day while pondering the nature of the Trinity he encountered a boy running back and forth from the sea filling a hole he had dug in the sand with water. When Augustine asked the child what he was doing, the boy said he was going to pour the sea into the hole. Augustine told the child that was impossible, to which the boy replied that it was also impossible for Augustine to fully comprehend the Trinity. It's a nice legend, it's also a good parallel of the last section of *De Trinitate*, Augustine's masterwork on the Trinity.

The second to last second section in the translation on my shelf is titled "The Image Perfected" and reminds us that we are made to share in the life of the Trinity, both in the life to come and here on earth. The last section is "The Absolute Inadequacy of the Image Perfected" that we are always able to grow more in union with the most holy Trinity, for as Augustine says in his closing prayer "Let me remember you, let me understand, let me love you. Increase these things in me until you refashion me entirely."

This prayer of Augustine should be ours as well, that we would grow in union with the most holy Trinity. One of the big themes from the diocesan synod on the 7th was the call to live discipleship outside of the parish, and to that end I would invite you to consider how you do so. One of my favorite stories of this is from one of my brother priests. His family was fairly non-practicing growing up, but his devout grandmother when facing cancer asked them to say a Hail Mary for her daily. The first month of doing so was awkward and weird and he as a teen felt stupid doing so. Within six months it was a highlight of his day (not that he would admit it), and within a year his family started attending mass regularly, and he was a priest 14 years after. When we open ourselves to the love of God, like the hole in the beach of sand, though we will be unable to contain all of his divine love, we will be filled with the love of the Lord.


Tyrell Ramsdell November 22, 1994 - May 21, 2025

CATHOLIC Q & A

ROSARIES AS DECORATIONS

Question: I've seen people hang rosaries over the rear-view mirrors in their cars and a few of them wear them around their necks. Is it OK to do that?

Answer: The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?

One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.
