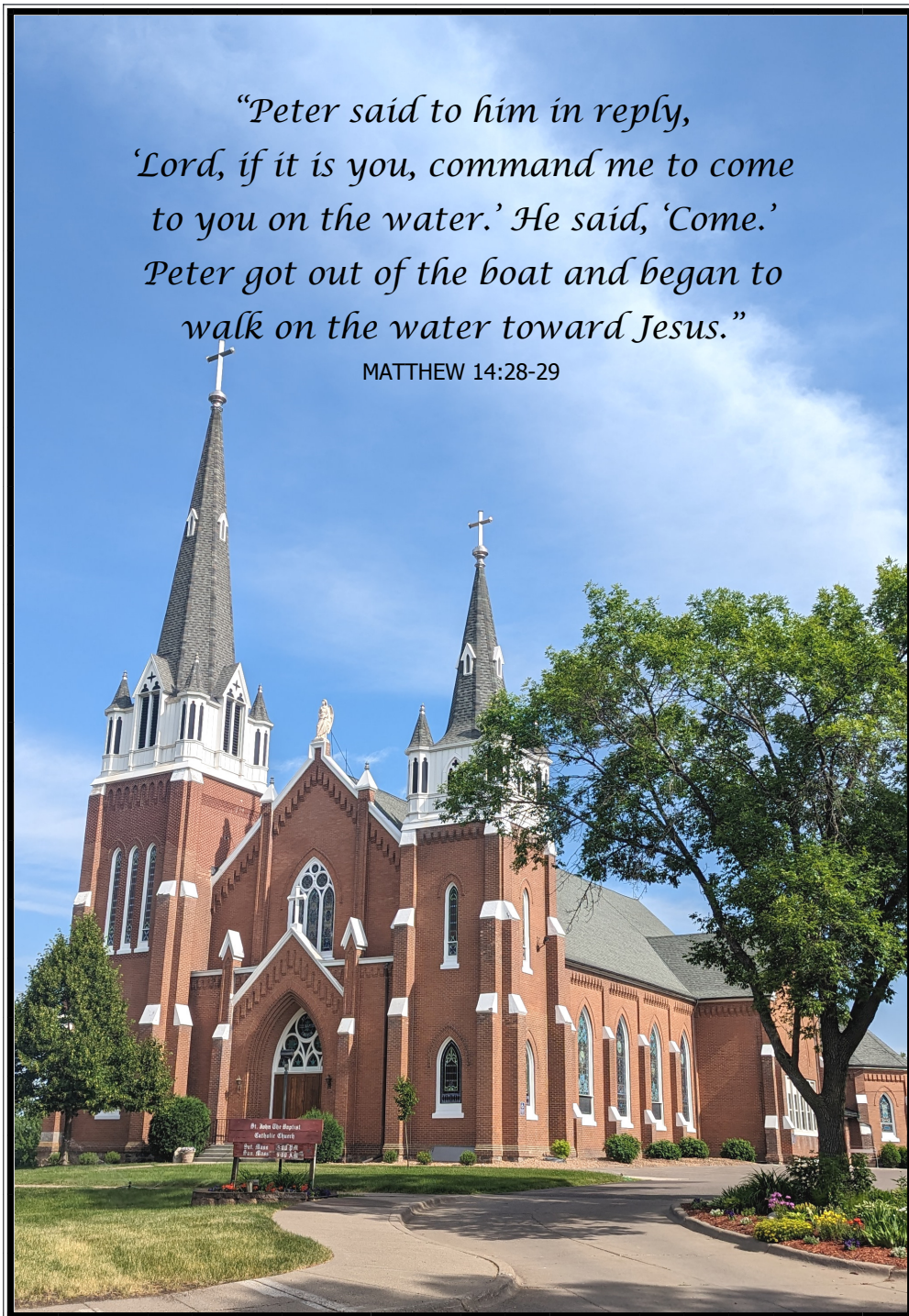

From the Pastor

One of the great lost pieces of art is the *Navicella* - a monumental mosaic depicting this weekend's gospel by the artist Giotto commissioned for the Holy Year of 1300. It was largely destroyed when Old St. Peter's was replaced by the current St. Peter's Basilica - though there are still fragments - but it would have been seen by pilgrims as they were leaving the basilica complex because it was on the back of the entrance arcade facing towards the church; like a medieval exit sign, expect 31 x 43 feet. The reason that I am bringing up the *Navicella* is that our parish festival is again in hindsight. I am always impressed by the turnout, by the volunteers, and the spirit of the festival, and while there is still a lot of administrative clean-up and logistical work to do, it can be easy to view the festival as a completed task. If we do that, I think we forget what the festival is for; and so, like the pilgrims at St. Peter's having completed their journey, we need to be reminded, like St. Peter to keep our eyes on Christ.

The point of our parish festival, the point of everything we do at St. John's is to help each other grow in relationship and friendship with Jesus Christ, and as people united in that common goal, with one another. I've made reference to the Archbishop's latest letter "Only One Thing is Necessary", but now that we've completed the festival, Archbishop Hebda has asked that we go deep into this letter this fall, to help create holy Catholics marriages, families, and communities, and how we can continue to do what you have demonstrated so well this last week - that we support each other and grow in communion and fellowship.

RECLAIMING SUNDAYS

The focus of the third and fourth year of the Synod Implementation Plan centers on the family and parents as primary educators of their children. The Year 3 initiative has been subtitled "Reclaiming Sundays" and each parish of the Archdiocese is asked to assist this effort. Each month we give you a new theme and some sample activities to help you put into practice that theme in order to help you live out the gift of Sunday to its fullest.

August - Service and Prayer

"Inviting to a meal people who are alone, visiting the sick, providing food for families in need, spending a few hours in voluntary work and acts of solidarity; these would certainly be ways of bringing into people's lives the love of Christ received at the Eucharistic table." - *Dies Domini* 72

When we receive the love of Christ at the Eucharist it is right to go outward and share that love. Upon reception into the Body of Christ it is natural for one to then seek to serve Christ's body in the world. Sample activities for August:

- Liturgical Living: August 15 is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Go to Mass, pray the glorious mysteries, put fresh flowers and a Mary statue in your prayer space.

CATHOLIC Q & A

JESUS IS LIGHT OF THE WORLD

Question: Why do we call Jesus "the light of the world"?

Answer: In cultures around the world, light and darkness are chief symbols of good and evil, order and chaos, clarity and confusion, hope and despair. These symbols tap into something essential about the nature of things. God has given us the created world as a gift. His first work, as we see in Genesis 1, is to create *light*, giving meaning and insight to the abyss. It is in the light that rest of creation comes to be. A gathering darkness emerges in Genesis 3. Adam and Eve hide, shrouding themselves from the sun's rays and the gaze of God. While God offers a promise of salvation and establishes a covenant with His people, the sense of fog and dim understanding still remain. The Hebrew people repeatedly betray the promises they have made to God, and all around them the nations actively worship idols.

The promise of God is not in vain, however. In John 1, we see a depiction of Christ as primordial goodness, order, clarity, and hope. *"The true light, which enlightens everyone was coming into the world ... this life was the light of the human race"* (John 1: 9, 4). Think of the last sunrise you witnessed (if you could wake up for it!). As you watched the lavender brighten to rose edged with gold, did your heart swell? Did you recall the goodness of the world? Did you feel rekindled hope? Such is the role of Christ in the soul. Such is his coming Incarnate in our world.
