SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE

C.R.O.S.S. is holding its annual School Supply Drive from now through August 24. All school supplies and cash donations are being accepted. Please leave your donations in the food shelf bins at the entrances.

Items needed: backpacks, colored pencils (12 count pkg.), Crayola Crayons (24 count pkg.), #2 pencils (10/12 pack), wide or narrow washable markers (8 colors pack), dry erase markers, black sharpies, yellow highlighters, scissors (blunt, 7 inch adult, or pointed), spiral notebooks or loose leaf paper (college/wide-ruled), Elmer's white school glue, glue sticks, black, blue or red pens, pocket folders (colored), 12" ruler (cm/"), watercolor paints, zippered pencil pouches, #2 mechanical pencils (10/12 pack), and erasers.

FESTIVAL TENT PURCHASE

Because the company that we rent the tents from made the decision to no longer rent these specific tents after this year and offered to sell them to us at a reduced price, the Festival Committee made the decision to purchase them. The purchase price was \$18,000 with this year's rental fee of \$4,320 going toward the purchase price (the fees to rent the new tents they will be carrying would have been over \$9,800 next year). 3 generous parishioners have donated \$3,500.00 towards the purchase of the tents with a challenge for others to help defray the cost of purchasing the old tents. If you would like to make a donation toward the purchase of these tents, please clearly mark your donation "Festival Tents" and drop it in the regular collection basket or mail it to the church.

CATHOLIC Q & A

PARISH REGISTRATION

Question: Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Answer: Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

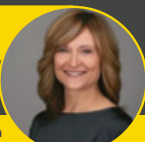
