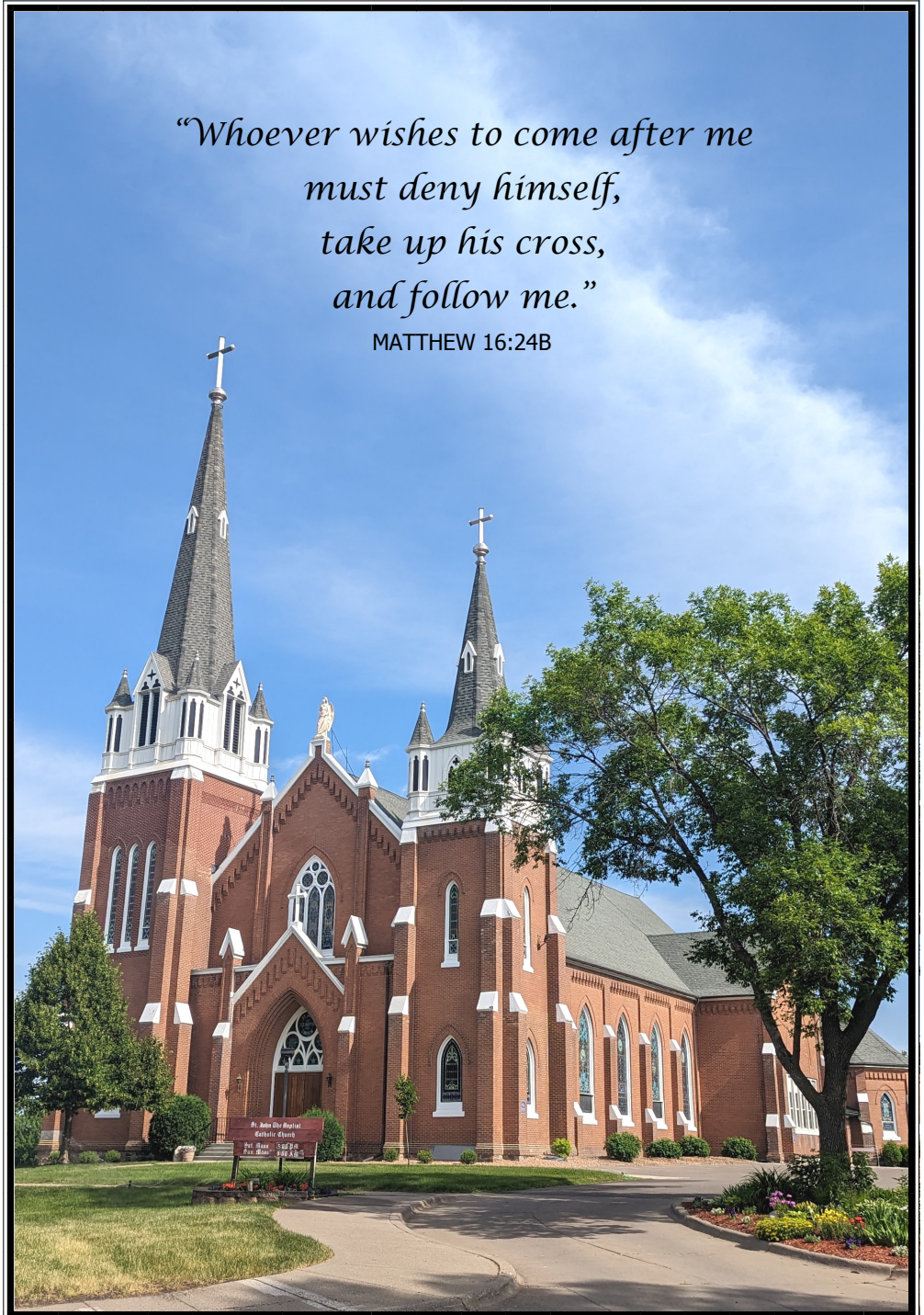

From the Pastor

As we are fast approaching the end of summer- I'm organizing my trip to the state fair with my friends as I write this - I thought it might be helpful to talk through the fall. As you all hopefully know, we have a Faith Formation Open House this weekend, and Faith Formation starts September 16th. As was mentioned by Sarah, we hope to offer adoration those nights, as well as resuming adoration on Fridays, though for the first month of adoration, our dates will be spotty as I'm on vacation September 25 - October 5 and on retreat October 12-16, though thankfully my calendar stabilizes after that.

In addition, on TLC Family Nights, we are planning for a series of talks about the Archbishop's new pastoral letter, so even if you don't have a child in faith formation, check your calendars as once a month those will be coming up. Connected to the letter, our parish small groups will also begin their normal school year activities, so please watch for more information about that, and beginning in late October I will be offering accelerated OCIA classes for those who would like to become Catholic, receive their missing sacraments of initiation (usually Confirmation), or just want to learn more about their faith following the 9 a.m. masses - so if you know anyone who would like to be Catholic for Christmas, please spread the word and invite them.

Finally, we have a new hire to announce - Dianna Anderson will be beginning as our Director of Music this fall, allowing Sharon Williams to retire. Dianna has previously worked at Mary, Queen of Peace and St. Thomas in Corcoran, and is familiar to the daily mass crowd, as well as hosting a showcase of her music students here yearly. Sharon has an extraordinary tenure here at St. John's and we owe her a deep deal of gratitude, I and my brother priests especially for her patience in this change and in so many other ways. There will be more details about this changeover, and information about welcoming Dianna in the weeks to come, as part of what should be a very active fall, but please make sure to thank Sharon for her many years of service.

CATHOLIC Q & A

PRIEST VESTMENTS

Question: Why do priests wear vestments? Do they have a special meaning?

Answer: Vestments are clothes worn for a specific purpose. Priests will joke that they cover a thousand flaws. But our own manner of dress often corresponds to what we do. We dress up for special occasions, and for special guests. We wear certain clothes for golf, for outdoor activities, and years ago, we even had our "Sunday best" clothes we wore just for Church. Vestments are much the same, and each one has a meaning. The alb is a reminder of the baptismal garment. The stole is a symbol of ordained ministry and authority within the Church. The chasuble reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage of faith, passing through this life towards heaven.

Priests wear vestments for two basic reasons. First, they draw attention to the importance and solemnity of the act of worship. The color of the vestments indicates the season of the year or the feast being celebrated. Secondly, vestments draw attention to what the priest does, rather than who he is. In the celebration of the Mass, the focus is on what we do together, on our common unity, and on the mystery and person of Christ.

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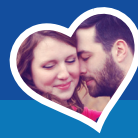
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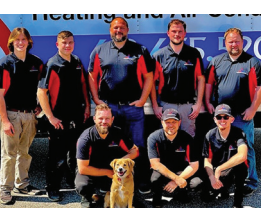
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
