

From the Pastor

An outsider observer might find my upbringing morbid. My mom was one of the first female licensed funeral directors in the state of Minnesota (I'm very proud of her career even though she doesn't toot her own horn much) and my paternal grandfather got very into genealogy in his retirement so when he would come to visit we'd always go wandering through the graveyards of the south metro looking for the descendants of his greatuncles who had stopped in Minnesota when their brother (my great-great-grandfather) had continued out to Montana to homestead. Because of that it's a semi-custom and a bit of an inside joke that when we travel some place as a family, we visit cemeteries.

With that qualifier, I still would encourage everyone sometime in these next couple weeks to visit one or both of our parish cemeteries. The "new" one is of course just a short walk from the parking lot, and while the old cemetery is a bit more of a drive, it is very old for our state. While the Catholic Church grants an indulgence in the first part of November for those who visit a cemetery, pray for the departed, and fulfills the usual conditions - so a very easy indulgence for us to merit - I've found that visiting cemeteries also contextualizes things for me. It reminds of those who have gone before, whose legacy I am resting on, and reminds me that I myself also am called to live my life to the fullest, so that when one day I die, I hopefully will be counted among the Saints.

There is always more that can be said - the way we treat the dead reflects the dignity they had in life, expressing our hope in the resurrection, etc. but I find November particularly calls us to reflect on the gifts that God had given us, to engage in thanksgiving, and also to hope, as we approach the end of the liturgical and calendar years, in the merciful love of God.

TLC FAMILY - THIS WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 5

This Wednesday is our second TLC Family session with everyone meeting from 6:00 - 7:00 p.m. Adults will meet in the Church for their session with Sheila on the first section of the book *Catechism of Hockey*. Confirmation students will have their regular class with Father Powers in the chapel. The younger students will all have class, but from 6:00 - 7:00 p.m. rather than their regular time. RECLAIMING SUNDAYS

The focus of the third and fourth year of the Synod Implementation Plan centers on the family and parents as primary educators of their children. The Year 3 initiative has been subtitled "Reclaiming Sundays" and each parish of the Archdiocese is asked to assist this effort. Each month we will give you a new theme and some sample activities to help you put into practice that theme in order to help you live out the gift of Sunday to its fullest.

November - Beauty and Prayer

"God looked at everything he had made and found it very good." Gen 1:31 - On Sunday we are called to participate in appreciating the beauty that is all around us and participate in it. Beauty can evoke in us an appreciation for what God has created in our life and lead us to participate in that creation through the materials around us. We are called to find and assist in creating beauty through the ordinariness of family life. Sample Activities for November:

- Explore the beauty of our cathedral, basilica, or your parish by taking time to explore the art. Learn about the saints you see. If you have time, draw pictures of your favorite image or take a family photo with a beautiful sacred image in the background. Turn this into a small moment of evangelization by making it your Christmas card photo.
- Create a small sacred space (prayer table/family altar in your home. Enlist contributions from everyone in your family to make it beautiful (flowers, draw pictures of Jesus, etc.)
- Color with your children.
- Share passionate projects in which you create (the woodshop, knitting, etc.).
- Liturgical Living: Near the beginning of the month, visit a
 family member's gravesite. Make it neat and bring flowers
 (if permitted by the cemetery). Pass on family stories about
 this person to your children. Learn the Eternal Rest prayer
 and pray it daily for those you know who have died. Pray for
 the souls in purgatory this month.
- Recommended resource to assist in building habits of prayer is the Hallow App.

CATHOLIC Q & A

RESURRECTION OF THE DEAD

Question: What do Catholics believe about the resurrection of the dead?

Answer: Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe "in the resurrection of the body." Does that mean Christ's resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus' resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it's also a sign of what's to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It's an effect of original sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be our body. If we are in heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what this glorification will be like based on Jesus' resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus broke bread with his disciples? We don't really know the answers to these questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. Christ redeems us as whole persons, body and soul! ©LPi

Did You Know?

- Without the AMS there would be no Catholic chaplains. The AMS is the only Catholic diocese in the United States responsible for endorsing priests to serve as military chaplains and for the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers.
- AMS faithful are the men and women serving in the United States Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at a Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders and their families.
- Programs and services readily available in other U.S. dioceses, and vital to the men, women, and children served by the AMS, include Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal, Vocations, and the pastoral care of Veterans.
- The AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is the only U.S. Vocations Program that provides priests to serve as military chaplains, and also to serve in parishes and dioceses across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers.
- In 2024, the number of sacraments celebrated for AMS faithful included 1,450 baptisms, 872 confirmations, 1,127 first Holy Communions, and 143 marriages.
