

From the Pastor

The Solemnity of Christ the King is one of my personal favorite celebrations of the Church year. Not only is it a fitting conclusion to the liturgical year, but as you all should know by now, early modern European history is my particular area of interest, and one of the hallmarks of this period is the collapse of absolute monarchy in Europe.

This is largely because although monarchies were instrumental in the process of creating European nationstates, they were unable to keep up with the agricultural and industrial revolutions and the rise of the merchant class. The kings of Europe were unable or unwilling to maintain their relationships with their subjects, and so they fell or ceded some of their power, in ways that I'm sure were horrifying to live through but make for (in my opinion) very interesting history.

Jesus Christ does not have that problem. The second person of the Godhead knows us better than we know ourselves, and even more so endured suffering and death so that He may experience everything we experience but sin. His kingship invites us, like the good thief in today's Gospel, to acknowledge Him as Lord, to accept Him not just as King of the universe, but our King. If Christ truly is our King, that should mark how we live our lives.

Throughout the season of Advent, I plan on preaching on some of the basics about how we as Catholics acknowledge this relationship with the Lord. I'll also be recording a series of brief talks for our small groups that tie into these concepts by focusing on the lives of five of the Saints of the Roman canon, so I would encourage you, in this busy time of year, to join one of these small groups. It's one of the ways we support each other in our faith in Christ, our King.

CATHOLIC Q & A

WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Question: What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Answer: The practice of Eucharistic Adoration is a centuries old ritual and falls within a broader category of devotions and rituals that are associated with the Sacrament of the Eucharist. In a particular way, Eucharistic Adoration is an extension of the worship and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament that occurs in every Mass. In a long-standing practice, a period of Eucharistic Adoration often ends with "benediction," the blessing of the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.

Several parishes throughout the United States have introduced the practice of perpetual Eucharistic Adoration, while other communities have the custom of shorter periods of Eucharistic Adoration. Care should always be taken that these periods of adoration respect the instructions outlined in Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass, the liturgical book that gives the instructions for the proper celebration of Eucharistic Adoration.

Although adoration of the Blessed Sacrament can never take the place of Eucharistic Communion, many Catholics find great comfort and consolation in their prayers before the Eucharist enshrined in the tabernacle or when it is exposed in the monstrance (both are equally valid, as Christ is not more present in one than in the other). But when we consider our Eucharistic devotions, it is always important to remember the fundamental connection these acts of devotion have to the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass and reception of Christ in Communion. ©LPi
